# DEDUCTIVE REASONING

("Top-Down" approach to reasoning. Begins with a theory and narrows down through observation until confirmation.)

Show the client the first card of the sequence and ask them to tell you what they think will happen next. (For example show the candles on the cake being lit.) Show the next picture of the sequence and repeat the question. Discuss the answers they gave & the pictures that came out in a positive manner to allow for improving deductive reasoning skills. (For example you might say: "You thought they were going to eat the cake next, but we see they had to blow out the candles and cut it first. Why is that?")

# INDUCTIVE REASONING

("Bottom-Up" approach to reasoning. Begin with an observation & look for a pattern in open exploration of ideas to form a theory.)

Show only the first & last cards to the client. (For example show 'the candles on the cake being lit' card and the 'cake cut' card). Ask them to look at the differences in the last card & then ask: "What might have caused this?" After discussion, put out the missing middle cards to see how the story line actually played out. Discuss in a positive manner, the answers they gave and the pictures that came out to encourage improving and expanding inductive

reasoning skills.

As with most new concepts being introduced, prior to using these cards it is advisable to first discuss and explain all of the concepts of sorting and sequencing these kinds of cards.

## LONG SENTENCE BUILDING:

If they are capable, ask the client to create one long sentence describing the overall story line of all four of the cards or a select number of them.

## **IMAGINATIVE STORY MAKING:**

Mix up cards from different Sequential sets. Ask the client to arrange them in any order they wish, and then make up and tell an imaginative and creative story using the various pictures as the prompt to connect the storyline. This can be silly fun!

### **BECAUSE THIS HAPPENED:**

Silly Fun: Ask the client to describe the story line starting with the last card and working backwards using a "because" phrase in between. They might say "The cake is cut because the candles are out." "The candles are out because the boy blew them out." etc.

#### FLUENCY SENTENCE LEVEL PRACTICE

Monitor & discuss fluency goals of the client in sentence & spontaneous language levels as they describe & talk about the sequential picture card story lines.

#### **TURN TAKING**

In a small group have clients take turns with each card in the sequence to complete all four with the various goals in mind (such as everyone gives a past tense descriptive sentence of their cards).

## LANGUAGE SAMPLES

These materials lend themselves well to collecting language samples! Monitor the free speech generated as the client uses expressive verbal language to talk about the picture storylines of the assembled the sequential cards. FOR EVEN MORE OPPORTUNITIES: Try putting the cards in different incorrect orders to encourage spontaneous language discussions about why the order of the cards is wrong and could not work!
